Who We Are

The 42 Division Community Police Liaison Committee (CPLC) is made up of members who are representatives from the community and police.

Working in partnership with the Officers at 42 Division, we are dedicated to increasing safety and security for the public by identifying community and policing concerns while developing and supporting local initiatives.

Our members live within the geographical area of 42 Division.

Our Mandate is

- To establish and maintain meaningful Community Police partnerships
- To be proactive in community relations, safety concerns and crime prevention
- To assist in problem solving local police issues
- To act as a resource to the Toronto Police and to the community

What is the CPLC Student Award?

The 42 Division CPLC Student Award program is an initiative of the CPLC to provide some financial assistance to youth living and attending school in our community.

This initiative is a partnership between 42 Division and the CPLC.

Two \$500 awards are given: Applicants must have demonstrated leadership, academic achievement and a commitment to the community.

Who Can Apply?

A candidate must meet <u>all</u> of the following criteria:

- Enrolled in Grades 9 to 12 at the time of the application
- Live and attend school in the geographic area of 42 Division
- 42 Division boundaries are: On the West Victoria Park; On the East the Scarborough/Pickering border; On the South the 401; and on the North the south side of Steeles Avenue East.
- Have demonstrated a commitment to co-curricular activities
- Completed more than 40 hours of volunteer service
- Currently enrolled full-time, in a recognized academic institution at time of submission
- Possess a passing grade in all subjects

Who is NOT eligible?

- Person(s) related to a CPLC member
- Person(s) related to members of Toronto Police Services
- Person(s) who have received this award within the last 2 years
- Person(s) who do not live or attend school in 42 Division.

How Do I Apply?

Complete the attached application form and submit your application with all required documents by May 21st, 2019.

Electronic submissions will not be accepted.

Documents required:

- A minimum of 2 letters of reference with at least one originating from your school and one from a community organization
- Your most recent certified Student Credit Counselling Summary and Timetable
- Essay as described in Section C and attached to application

Who Makes the Decision?

A judging panel comprised of Police Officers from 42 Division and members of the CPLC. The Award recipient will be notified no later than <u>June 1st, 2019</u>. The successful candidate will be expected to attend the 42 Division Annual Picnic on **Saturday, June 8th, 2019** to receive their award.
